

## Flowery Shawl Pattern from Husflit

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### Materials:

- Yarn in different colours



I used a Swedish yarn called [Bianca](#) in one each of the colours seen above. I had to buy 2 skeins of white and coral. I don't know exactly how much of the other skeins I used but I have a lot of yarn leftovers in all colours.

- Crochet hook size 3 mm
- Large needle for sewing the squares together

You can use any yarn/hook you like, bearing in mind that it affects the size of the squares

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## Abbreviations with videos

**ch** = chain stitch [video](#)

**sl st** = slip stitch [video](#)

## How to make a square



Round 1: **ch** 6 use a **sl st** to make a ring

Round 2: **ch** 4, 1 **tr** in the ring, draw the yarn in both loops to make a cluster, **ch** 2. This is the first cluster (you can look at a tutorial about clusters from [crochet about here](#)) \*2 tr cluster in the ring, ch 2\* Repeat \* - \* 11 times = 12 double treble crochet clusters in the ring.

Round 3: ch 4, 3 tr in the first chain of 2 from round 2, join all with at sl st, ch 6 (this is the first cluster) \* 4 tr cluster, ch 6\* repeat \* - \* in every 2 ch from round 2 11 times = 12 4 tr clusters.

Round 4: ch 4, 2 tr , join them to a cluster in first chain of 6 from round 3, ch 6, 3 tr cluster in the same place, ch 3, \*1 sl st in next chain of 6, ch 6, 1 sl st I next chain of 6, ch 3, 3 tr cluster, ch 6, 3 tr cluster, ch 3\* Repeat from \* - \* 2 times. Fasten off. Now you can see that the flower is turning to a square.

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## How to make a half square



Round 1: ch 4, make a ring by using a sl st

Round 2: ch 4, 1 tr in the ring, draw the yarn in both loops to make a cluster, chain 2. This is the first cluster \*2 tr cluster in the ring, ch 2\* Repeat \* - \* 6 times= 7 clusters

Round 3: turn your work to the other side, ch 4, 3 tr in the first chain of 2 from round 2, join all with at slip stitch, ch 6 (this is the first cluster) \* 4 tr cluster, ch 6\* repeat \* - \* in every 2 ch from round 2 6 times = 7 4tr cluster

Round 4: turn your work to the other side, ch 4, 2 tr , join them to a cluster in first chain of 6 from round 3, ch 6, 3 tr cluster in the same place, ch 3, \*1 slip stich (sl st) in next chain of 6, ch 6, 1 sl st I next chain of 6, ch 3, 3 tr cluster, ch 6, 3 tr cluster, ch 3\* Repeat from \* - \*

## How many squares do you need?

The size of my shawl



I used **91 squares** and **14 half squares**. I made 4 groups of colors, red, blue, green and yellow. (see picture above)

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### Putting the squares together

I started by laying my squares out on my bed in order to get the colours arranged as I wanted them.

#### Sewing

I sewed all my squares together using a large needle and it took a while. It is important to choose a thread matching the colour of the actual square so you have to change threads a lot of times. The result turned out very nice and flat.

#### Crocheting

You can also use a crochet method putting the squares together. In that case you put two squares together and crochet single crochet stitches to connect the squares. I tried to do this but I felt that it turned out to be very hard to make flat result so I chose the sewing method instead.

#### Stretching (blocking)

I used a lot of plastic toy puzzle pieces to block my shawl. It is a perfect way to do this – look



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## Making the border



Round 1: Choose one of the colours you used to make the squares. Crochet sc all around. In the corners you have to make 3 sc in the same hole.

Round 2: dc in all sc from last round.

Round 3: Turn the work over, you are now going to crochet on the wrong side of the shawl. Crochet slip stitches in all dc from last round. Finished!



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### Making the tassels



Cut 2 long threads of yarn (I took 1 meter, try it out), put them together and chain 25 stitches with double yarn and a size 4 mm hook. Now you have very long ends, take the needle and pull the yarn twice in the last stitch. Make a knot and cut all the loose ends to the same length.

Okay, one tassel is ready. Only 56 left to go! Here you can see how I sewed the tassels onto the shawl.

I tried to use colours matching the actual square.
